A 1975 graduate of Wesleyan University, Mr. Tobey earned his J.D. from Suffolk University Law School in 1978, and his MBA from Suffolk University in 2005. He also served as Lieutenant in the U.S. Coast Guard Judge Advocate General Corps from 1978 to 1982, and as a senior attorney at the Massachusetts Water Resources Authority. He is admitted to practice law in New York and Massachusetts.
